DETAILS OF OFFENSE, PROGRESS OF INVESTIGATION, ETC.

PROGRESS REPORT:

We, Collier & Ott, received information from Det. Carpenter that there may be some bodies buried in the area of 505 W. 22nd. According to the witness, Ruby Jenkins, Dean Corll was seen burying something behind the building at that location back in 1965 or 1966. At that time Dean Corll and his mother were operating a candy manufacturing company at that location, known as the Corll Candy Co. Ruby Jenkins worked with them. She stated that on several occasions she saw Dean Corll digging behind the building. She ask him what he was doing and he told her that he was burying spoiled candy. She ask him why he did not put it in the trash and he said that the bees would get into it. She also said that he would wrap whatever he was burying in heavy plastic.

We went to 505 W. 22nd. and found that it is now the Automatic Coin Machine Exchange. We talked with Mr. Robert Edinger, who owns this company and got permission to dig behind this building. We also talked with Mr. Jack Herndon, who owns the property, and got permission from him to dig in this area.

Det. N. Newman brought six trustees from the jail to assist us. The Water Division sent a large digging machine and operator to assist us. All the area behind and along the east side of the building was dug up. Nothing of interest was found.

We then called the witness, Ruby Jenkins, to the scene and ask herto point out exactly where she had seen Corll digging. She pointed out several areas that had already been dug up.

Mr. Turner of the Harris County Medical Examiner's office was also present during the digging. We all agreed that there was no bodies buried in this area, so digging was stopped.

number #HO7-1885 but there is a missing report #CPD 274728 which cannot be found at this time. DANNY MICHAEL YATES will be the complainant in companion case #D-68911.

During the period 8/8/73 to 8/15/73, numerous items of evidence have been submitted to this laboratory by various officers.

Examination of this evidence reveals from the following:

1. The heavy nylon rope recovered from 4500 Silverbell is of the same type recovered from 2020 Lamar.
2. Human blood was detected on a rubber glove recovered from 2020 Lamar.
3. The personal papers submitted belonged to Edward L. and Jerry L. Waldrop.
4. The red cigarette lighter has the initials "DW" scratched on one side.
5. Type O human blood was detected in the blood-stained shirt from 2020 Lamar.
6. Marihuana was detected in the three pipes submitted.

Numerous hairs and fibers have been recovered from the evidence submitted and will be retained for possible future comparison.

DETAILS OF OFFENSE, PROGRESS OF INVESTIGATION, ETC.

PROGRESS REPORT

We Porter and Paulk went to the Juvenile Detention Ward and picked up Rhonda Williams and brought her to Homicide where she first talked to her Atty's RICHARD Haynes and Mike Ramsey. We then taped our interview with her and questioned her for about an hour. We learned that this 15 year old girl had seen Dean before when she had pickup up at a 7-11 store near her home and taken to home by Dean and Wayne Henley. Dean had dropped Wayne off at her home several times and left but had never come in. Rhonda had been going with Wayne for a week or so but had known him since the second grade. She stated that Wayne was more like a brother ##### to her than a boy friend. Rhonda stated that she had told Dean she wanted to get away from the house for a few days to make up her mind whether she wanted to run off with him to Colorado and Nevada. This was supposed to happen toward the end of the month. She knew that Dean was supposed to go also. She said that she had no idea that Wayne was Homosexual and that Wayne had called her and told her he was picking her up and had arrived with Tim in TIMS VW and that this was the first time she had ever met Timothy. On the way to Dean's house Wayne told her that Dean was Homosexual but that she didn't need to worry about it. We went thru the lists of known dead and also the missing and she told us those that she had known. She told us that Frank Aguire had been her fiance and they had planned to get married when he disappeared. Rhonda stated that it was her habit to often talk about Frank disappearing and that Wayne had told her several times to forget about Frank because he was never coming back.

Rhonda stated that she knew who David Brooks was by the Corvette that he drove but that she would probably not recognize him if he walked in. She had seen a girl in the Corvette with David at times and thought that it was the girl that he had married. She knew or had knowledge that something had happened to his other car and thought that he had wrecked it and then stated driving the Corvette.

Wayne had told Rhonda that he had been to Dallas several times with Dean and that a warehouse was in Dallas where she could make \$1500 a week doing something illegal but Wayne reportedly had never told her what it was.

After talking to Rhonda it is our opinion that she is telling the truth.

DETAILS OF OFFENSE, PROGRESS OF INVESTIGATION, ETC.

PROGRESS REPORT:

I went by the X that was on the map that is marked for evidence in this case and found this location to be GESSNER AT METRONOME. The 10,000 block of METRONOME intersects 2000 Gessner at this location. Metronome dead ends at GESSNER and on the SOUTHEAST corner is located ~~XXX~~ an EXXON service station and on the NORTHEAST corner is located a MEXICAN POTTERY SHOP. On the WEST side of GESSNER is a vacant block which consists of bushes and pine trees. This vacant lot is approx. 200 feet wide and 150 feet deep. I walked over this lot and could find nothing that would be of interest to this case. There is no indication as to why this X is on the map that CORLL had.

I went by 5823 BIRCHMONT in regards to a JESSE HOWARD that possibly knows something about CORLL. At this location I talked to FRANK HOWARD WM-15 brother of JESSE, who said that he only knew of CORLL through his brother and that he never met CORLL. FRANK said that his brother JESSE lived at the PRINCESSA APTS. but he didn't know which apt. his brother lived in. FRANK also said that he didn't even know CORLL LIVED at the PRINCESSA APTS. FRANK SAID that his brother usually gets home at approx. 7:00 pm and that he works for a trucking company but he doesn't know the name of it. FRANK said that his family had lived at this location for approx. 8 years, ever since they moved from OKLAHO: MA. FRANK doesn't know how his brother come into contac with CORLL but that JESSE has known him for several years. FRANK said his brothers phone number is 465-7235. HIS mother works at the beauty salon at ELLA AT 34TH. The name of this salon is ~~XXXXX~~ PORTRAITS BEAUTY SALON.

INVESTIGATION TO CONTINUE:

I Det. K. D. Porter contacted Jesse Howard and he came to the Homicide office and said that he had known Corll, Brooks and Henley and used to go into Corll's candy shop. ADMtted that he had stayed in ~~###~~ Corll's apartment for a week near the end of last summer but had no knowledge of what was going on. after the interrogation it is my opinion that he is telling the truth.

#26 was strangled with a hangmans noos e around his neck.

DETAILS OF OFFENSE, PROGRESS OF INVESTIGATION, ETC.

PROGRESS REPORT August 17, 1973

While in the Homicide Office working this case I called Mr. C. C. Abernathy, 3015 Broadmead, phone #666-5283 and talked to him about his seeing somebody carrying a body in or on Galveston Island. He told me that he had seen this sometime last spring and that three men carrying a large roll like a rug which hung like it had a body in it disappeared over the sand dunes. Abernathy said that he could not identify the three or remember what kind of vehicle they had but that he did feel that it appeared they were carrying a body. He agreed to show this location to us stating that it was on the beach between the south jetty and the ship channel. Shortly after I received a call from a woman who refused to identify herself stating that she had seen Dean Corll and Henley digging a hole on the beach in Galveston and latter burying something in it. She described the third person as having long blond hair and being taller than Henley which fits the description of Brooks. She gave a description as MR. Abernathy as to location. She stated that she was with two others.

August 18, 1973

I contacted Det Galvan in Galveston and made arrangements for Mr Abernathy to meet me in Galveston and on arriving at the Galveston PD and joining Det Galvan I found Gloria Martin WF 28, 4211 Lehigh, phone 661-8376 and Linda Holland WF 29, 4810 Beau Lane no phone who agreed to lead us to where they had seen Corll and Henley bury something on the beach. Mrs. Martin admitted that she was the one who had called me refusing to identify herself and that they had come down to Galveston to dig up the area where they had seen this and stopped at the Galveston PD to make sure it was all right. We were joined by Chief Lack and Cap. Lewis and went to the area in question and it was found that both reportees had been talking about the same sand dunes. We were unable to get any equipment to check the area out and it was agreed to meet Monday when we would be able to get equipment to make a better search.

PROGRESS REPORT: 8-21-73

Detectives had received information that a DANIEL ~~WENDE~~ POUNDS WM16 had been at the boat stalls at 4500 Silver Bell one night about 7-24-72 with two other boys and two girls in an empty unlocked stall and had been approached by a person close to Henley's description who invited them to a sniffing party. We learned that Daniel Pounds was now at Burnett Bayland and we went there to talk to him.

DANIEL OSHAY POUNDS, W/M/16, who is a ward of the Harris County Child Welfare, told us that he had met RICKY DEDOW, a boy named ROBERTO, and two girls one night about two days before he was sent to Triangle Boys Ranch outside of Alvin (sent there 7-26-72) and they had gone to the boat stalls where they had found an open stall. This was a stall in the portion of the stalls which run north and south. Corll's stall was in the portion which runs east and west. They had walked to this location from Hiram Clark across the field east of the stalls. Daniel stated that sometime around midnight one of the boys who was standing at the door of the stall they were in said that someone was coming. This person who approached the stall asked them if they wanted to go to a sniffing party. Daniel says that he asked if the girls could go and this person said no. Daniel said that at this time he left with the girls walking back across the field to Hiram Clark. He stated that he does not know if Ricky and Roberto went to the party or not since he has not seen them since. He also stated that he does not remember seeing any car there at the stalls. Daniel was shown a group of photos containing photos of Henley, Brooks, Corll, and HPD #161-489, HPD #127-44, and SO ID #92507. He viewed all these photos and picked out the photo of Henley saying that he was almost positive that this was the person who asked them to the sniffing party. He stated that the frontal picture looked like the man but the side photo he was not sure of, and stated that he felt this was the man but not positive from seeing the photo only.

While at Burnett Bayland Daniel introduced us to MARK DONHAM, W/M/17, who stated that he knew Henley pretty well from going to school with him and that he also knew Mark Scott, Billy Baulch, and Frank Aguirre. Donham told us that a boy named ~~LENLETH~~ VANCE, W/M/18, who lives on 23rd three houses east of Beall on the north side of the street knew a lot of the people involved including Brooks, Henley, and Rhonda Williams.

We were able to contact the step-father of Ricky Dedow, MELVIN BURNS, 13426 Melcher, 433-3418, and learned that Ricky is in school and home in the evenings.

At the specific request of the Harris County District Attorney's office this supplement is being written to cover all oral interviews and conversations between Detectives Hamel and Tucker and David Owen Brooks, on August 9 and 10, 1973.

August 9, 1973:

On This date Brooks was brought to the Homicide office from Lt. Belchers office and gave a written statement as is outlined in an earlier supplement. After finishing this supplement Brooks and Henley had a confrontation in the corner office of the Homicide office. At that time ~~Brooks stated that~~ Henly told Brooks that he had made a confession and had told everything that that it had made him feel much better and he suggested that Brooks also tell all that he knew. Brooks stated at that time that he was sticking with the statement that he had just made (referring to the witness statement.) At that time Brooks stated that he wanted to talk to his father before he talked to officers any more. He was put in the next office and allowed to talk to his father, and Henly left the Homicide office in custody of Pasadena officers enroute to Lake Sam Rayburn. After Brooks had talked to his father for a while Lt. B. Porter was called into the office and he talked to both Brooks and his father and in a few minutes Det. Tucker was called in to have Brooks warned before a judge. During the time that Det. Tucker was in the office with Brooks and his father, trying to locate a judge by telephone, Brooks stated that he had told his father about his involvement in the murders, that is that he knew about them and had seen some of them committed but that he had never done one himself. He stated that he did not want to talk about it anymore that night but that he would tell Det. Tucker all that he knew about it on Friday, August 10, 1973. He was then taken before the judge and warned and then he was placed in the city jail.

August 10, 1973.

At approx 7:30AM this date David Brooks was checked out of the ~~City~~ Jail and brought to the Homicide office by Det. Tucker and Hamel. He was placed in the second office from the Captains office and at that time he was asked if he would make a written statement. He stated that he had planned on making such a statement but that he would like to wait until his father arrived. He orally went over what he eventually put in his written statement and after he had done this he told officer that it would be alright to type the statement up but that he didn't want to sign the statement until his father arrived. This statement was typed and completed

at approx 10:30AM

After completing this statement Officer talked to Brooks briefly and during that conversation he was asked if he knew why most of the boys were reported missing right away. He stated that he had known most of the victims at least casually and that most of them were bad boys. He stated that most of them had run away before and their parents were used to their not coming home. After his father arrived Brooks wanted to talk to him and they had a conversation and then he signed his confession which was witnessed by his father and his uncle. Mr. Brooks stated that the only thing that he had wanted to know before they went any further was that his son had not actually taken a human life and ~~that~~ he stated that David had told him that he didn't actually kill anyone and he had also put that in his confession. As soon as the confession was signed and delivered to Lt. B. Porter we made preparations to leave for High Island where Brooks was to point out a grave site.

During the trip to High Island Brooks had no conversation at all except to tell us to get off of Interstate 10 at the Winnie Exit. He then directed us to High Island. We stopped at a Motel Restaurant and bought Hamburgers and cokes and then we proceeded to the beach under the direction of Brooks. He told us to turn left on Highway 87 and when we passed into Chambers county the asphalt surface on the road changed and Brooks directed us to stop. We pulled over and he got out and walked across the salt grass area and onto the beach, turned left and walked a few yards and pointed to a piece of broken cement and said "That is the rock that is over the grave that Dean Pointed out to me". We checked out the area around the rock and found lime around the rock and so we dug in that location, and found a decomposed body, wrapped in plastic. Brooks told us that he could not show us any other grave sights because he had only driven when they buried bodies at the beach, and that he would drive down the road, past the asphalt change and stop and Henly and Dean would carry the bodies over the grass area and bury them. He stated that the only reason he knew about the grave that he pointed out was because dean had showed it to him. He did tell us that there should be 6 bodies at the beach. That dean had buried, (the one under the rock) and five more that he had driven down to that area. The only thing that he could remember about the time span involved in the burials at the beach was that the last one was about a year ago. (It should be noted that this is not in agreement with the body found in Jefferson County).

He was sent back to the station and we had no further conversation with him until he was checked out that night and gave Assistant DA Mike Hinton the confession concerning Billy Lawrence. There is a supplement covering that interview.

A tip regarding the Father of WAYNE HENDLEY came in to the office and this was to the effect that WAYNE HENDLEY SR. was in Mount Pleasant working at a chicken house and a call was made to the PD there and Det. Mars is checking and a radio gram with this information was sent also.

PROGRESS REPORT

Young and Baker obtained a set of photos...all of young white males from the Pasadena PD and these had been taken to them by the family of Dean Corll.

Carl Siebenneicher took these photos on 8-27-73 and took them and showed them to Mr. Oates and Mr. Tyson and the only ones they knew were of Wayne Henley and the little Albright boy. Then Daniels at Reagan HS was checked with and he thought that the one marked Billy looked familiar and it might be Baulch but it was later learned from the officials at Waltrip HS that it was not. It was learned that Ridinger graduated from there in August 1970 and they had a photo of him and the assistant principal Mr. Weygandt ID'ED most of the photos as that of Ridinger. At Hogg HS the attendance clerk did not recognize any of the photos and the files were checked to see if the Waltrip brothers attended school there and the records did not show that they did nor could any record be found of them at Hamilton. A run was then made by the service station that belongs to Det Carl's Uncle and this is on Studewood and he looked through the photos and ID'ED two of them, one in color and one in black and white and these were of LEROY, this is LEROY LEWANDOWSKI wm 22 and he also said that this subject had a father living at 743 East 6 1/2 and a run was made by there and the father ID'ED the photos as being old ones of his son and the father named Leon said that his son had known DEAN for a long time but there was never any indication that he was queer or at least the son never admitted to this. The son works at Texas Processing and Equipment off Washington and Shepherd, lives at 510 West 24th and has a non pub number 864 5487. Need to talk to this LEROY and see if he admits knowing DEAN CORLL and see if there was any love making between them, this subject would not tell if his wife is around was mentioned by the father. Regarding the photos, it might be that R. Ridinger could ID some of these photos.

In the AM on the 29th., Young and Baker went to the Tenneco offices and met with Mr. Karrick, Manager of Internal Security for Tenneco and his office along with Mr. Clyde Wilson had investigated a drug operation and later some harrassment by phone calls and during this investigation it was noted that a subject named RAY HERNANDEZ had mentioned that he had been at a party and DEAN CORLL had come in and left and Ray also mentioned that a friend of his was queer and a good friend of Corlls. Statements from subjects interviewed by Karrick attached.

DETAILS OF OFFENSE, PROGRESS OF INVESTIGATION, ETC.

PROGRESS REPORT:

On this date a LEROY LE WANDOWASKI (WM) (21) 510 " . 24th. 864 -5487 came into Homicide, he stated he had been contacted and was requested to come in for an interview regarding any knowledge he had on this case.

We have two photographs of this subject that was recovered from Dean Coralls property. I showed Leroy the two pictures and he stated that he gave the pictures to Dean Corll because he liked him at that time, he stated Dean was living on 6 1/2 street (about the 700 block) at the time and had a candy store, he use to go by and see him once in a while, he went to his house several times, that Dean use to give him candy and was very friendly. He stated that he was about 15 or 16 years old then.

Leroy stated that he and JOHN MATHEWS (who was about his same age) ran around a little together then and they both went to Galveston and spent the day on the beach with Dean Corll a couple of times. They went in swimming.

I showed Leroy all the pictures that I had in the file and he picked out a picture of JOHN MATHEWS from among the same pictures that we found his in, there was three pictures of John Mathews riding a motor cycle.

Leroy stated that Dean came by Reagan Hi School one day and hit him up to have sex with him and he refused him, he said this was the only time Dean asked him to do this and when he learned he was queer he stoped running around near him. He said the last time he saw Dean was somewhere out on Yale street in the north end, Dean was driving a white van truck and there was someone else in the truck but he didn't notice who it was, He didn't talk to him or stop him at that time.

Leroy didn't know Wayne or DAVID AND DID Not know any one else that Dean ran around with. He didn't know any one else that went over to Deans.

I asked him if he had seen John Mathews lately and he said he wasn't sure but he thought he saw him about three months ago. He wasn't very sure about it at all.

Leroy stated the last address he knew on Mathews was somewhere on Voite street.

Leroy went to Harvard Elem., HOGG Jr. HI, AND REAGAN SR. HI schools.

I checked Juvenile records and they showed no record on this John Mathews.
